

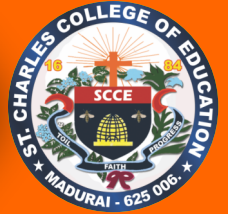

- Orientation is given at the start of the academic year to develop a passion for the profession of teaching through conferences and workshops conducted by specially invited efficient teacher trainers.
- Introducing reputed teachers as guest lecturers and resource persons for various sessions and occasions throughout the year to illustrate and exemplify the nobility of a teacher's profession.

Academic Excellence

- Orientation sessions are arranged at the beginning of every academic year to familiarize the new entrants with the curriculum and its transaction in the classroom.
- Every year pass percentage in the University Examinations reveals that a lot of effort has been put into sustaining the academic excellence.
- The Institution has employed the approach to teaching-learning in order to stimulate creativity and critical

thinking in the student-teachers besides the other curricular transaction methods.

- The staffs have dynamically engaged in teaching, research and publication within the boundaries of acceptable academic standards.
- The College organizes seminars/conferences/workshops at the state, national level and international level. The compendium of seminar papers are published with ISSN and ISBN code. Teachers are facilitated to attend such programs both in the College and in other institutions. Presentation of thematic and research papers is encouraged among the faculty.
- The institution has provided an academic ambience in terms of augmenting its resources and facilities for the benefit of the staff and students.
- The remedial classes for the slow learners have been conducted to keep pace with other learners.

- Moderately stacked college library has more than 5000 (five thousand) books, national and international journals and newspapers. In addition to the books and journals, the syllabus guidelines and question bank are also made available to the students.
- The internet is available throughout the day in the college computer laboratory.
- Student teachers are trained for adroit use of ICT technology, such as overhead projector, LCD projector, Photocopier, DVD, audio players, and multimedia CDs for effective curriculum transaction.

A SHORT HISTORY OF THE CONGREGATION

The congregation of the Sisters of St. Charles Borromeo was founded in 1684 by Rev. Fr. Adrian Bresy (Parish Priest of Wez) diocese of Tournai, Belgium, to impart Christian education to the poor children of the Parish.

St. Charles Borromeo was chosen as patron of the new-born Congregation because of his zeal for the church, great love for the poor, life of austerity and industriousness and his heroic work of reformation achieved through the weapon of education.

The year 1684 was the death centenary year of St. Charles Borromeo. The foundation of the congregation in the same year was a happy coincidence which favoured the choice of him as our Patron. Following the footsteps of this holy saint the Sisters were soon came to be known as the Sisters of St. Charles Borromeo.

St. Charles Borromeo was born on 2nd October 1538 in the fortress of Arona in Italy. He became Cardinal at the age of 21. On 4th September 1563 he became the Bishop of Milan. He

worked for the poor, the marginalized the widows and orphans. He died at 9 O' clock in the evening on Saturday 3rd November 1584. We celebrate his feast on 4th November.

SCB's in India

The first missionary sisters from Belgium built their abode at Ranipet in Vellore district in the year 1929. Today we have extended our mission stations to different continents. In India we have about 60 communities spread out from North to South and East to West. We are engaged mostly in educating children.

SCB 'Sisters' Mission in Madurai

The community at Madurai was founded in the year 1969 and it has organized itself in to a branch society of St. Charles Society namely 'St. Charles Society - Madurai' in the year 1990. The society runs a Primary School for boys and girls, a Higher Secondary School for girls and a Matriculation School for boys and girls. Hostel facility is provided to the students and staff coming from distant places. A charitable home for the aged destitute is also managed by the society. In this home there are forty senior citizens given shelter, food, medical and spiritual care. A health center for the inmates of the institutions and the local patients is also available. St. Charles College of Education is an Institution of the Society of St. Charles, Madurai belonging to the congregation of the Sisters of St. Charles Borromeo.

"Imparting Christian education through all our ministries" being the part of the charism of the congregation, this institution intended especially for educating the educators to acquire academic excellence insists on the importance of inculcating spiritual values - faith in God, in others and in one self and to practice the virtues such as compassionate love, prayer, silence, humility, sacrifice, forgiveness, etc., and to create a spiritual atmosphere in the college campus.

Principles of respecting Human Rights, Justice and Equality are upheld. Appreciating the creation and acknowledging the Fatherhood of God and brotherhood of man are highly valued.

Our college aims at forming mature women teachers who are enlightened, committed to empowering the marginalized and building a truly secular nation.

Satisfied with our performance, our college was accredited with 'B' grade with three stars on 16th September 2011 by NAAC on the recommendations of the peer team for a period of five years.

COLLEGE REGULATION

(ADMISSION)

The institution provides education for Christian women, but admits students irrespective of caste or creed provided they abide by the rules of the institution. A graduate of any recognized University may apply for admission in the B.Ed., Course. Admission is subjected to the approval of the Tamilnadu Teachers Education University, Chennai.

Eligibility for admission to the course

Candidates with at least 50% marks either in the Bachelor's Degree and/or in the Master's Degree in Sciences/ Social Sciences/ Humanity, Bachelor's in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks or any other qualification equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission to the program.

The reservation and relaxation for SC/ST/OBC/PWD and other categories shall be as per the rules of the Central Government/ State Government, whichever is applicable.

PROBATION

A student is on probation for the first term at least. If it appears to the Principal and staff that any student is not likely to become an effective teacher and if she shows no genuine improvement within a reasonable time, she will be asked to withdraw from the program of teacher preparation. No student will be released from attendance until the college course is completed. The fee once paid shall not be refunded under any circumstance.

DISCIPLINARY RULES

The rules of the discipline shall include the following:

1. Every student wears a clean and respectable dress conforming to the rules of modesty.

2. College uniform should be worn by the students on every prescribed day and White Chudidhar on some special days.
3. Every student teacher endeavours to become a model of courtesy that is expected of a student; she shows respect to employees, staff and students.
4. No student leaves the classroom without the permission of the lecturer.
5. Students moving from one class to another should do so in an orderly manner.
6. Students are expected to take an active interest in maintenance of cleanliness and peaceful atmosphere of the college. A good teacher does what is needed to be done, grows in dignity by respecting both work and the worker. Damage of furniture or property of the college, will not be tolerated.
7. Students should be well informed through wide reading about political and social problems but should not engage in political action during the professional year. Private collection of funds may not be made without the express and written approval of the college authorities. Those who disturb the studious atmosphere and tone of the college will severely be dealt with. All students are expected to conduct themselves in such a manner to safeguard the good name of the college and of the teaching profession.
8. Students are not allowed to keep the mobile phones with them during the class hours.

SPECIAL FACILITIES

IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell)

The IQAC is a part of the institutional system and works towards realizing the aims of the college. The aim of IQAC is to develop a system conscious, consistent and catalytic to improve the academic and administrative performance of the Institution.

Spate of growth and diversification of activities are common to all educational institution but the need for quality control through timely check is systematically implemented by the assistance of IQAC. The IQAC of St. Charles College of Education started on 10.08.2009 is in function offering it's faithful service.

Guidance and Counseling

A guidance and counseling cell is made available in the campus. Every fortnight, students are given common instruction to enhance the skill for solving problems. Personal guidance is given as per the need of the individuals.

Grievance Redressal Cell

It is good to air a grievance rather than to keep it bottled up. Protection of human rights is essential for all round development of an individual's personality. To realise the primary needs of the students and staff and secure civil liberties for everybody, a Grievance Redressal Cell has been constituted. The cell is indented to find solutions for problems like ragging, sexual harassment – any kind of physical or mental harassment, Complaints regarding class room teaching – class room management, completion of syllabus, teaching methods etc., if and when they arise. The Grievance Redressal Cell convenes meetings periodically and takes steps to redress the grievance.

In our college the students' Grievance Redressal Committee is constituted by the Principal; who is the chairman of

the committee. It consists of members from among the staff and the students.

Feed-back from the inmates of the College (students, office- staff, members of the faculty and others) are collected through suggestion box which is placed in the administrative block verandah.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

1. Application for leave, with details regarding the period and the reasons, should be submitted to the principal at least one day in advance.
2. When leave is applied owing to sickness, a certificate from a Registered Medical Practitioner may be required.
3.
 - i) Students are not permitted to absent themselves without leave/prior permission.
 - ii) In case, where absence without leave note is unavoidable, leave note must be submitted on the day of rejoining, signed both by the student teacher and the parent/guardian.
 - iii) Absence without leave for a part of the day or for a full day will be counted as absence for one and two days respectively.
 - iv) A student will forfeit one day casual leave for every two time marked late.
 - v) Without applying for leave, if a student absents herself she will have to pay the fine.
4. The necessary attendance certificate will not be granted unless the principal is satisfied that the student's progress and conduct have been satisfactory and that she has attended 85% of the number of working days in the academic year and the full period of teaching practice. In case of shortage of attendance, application for

condonation must be made to the university authority. Unless such condonation is obtained, students may not be permitted to take the examination.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Physical Education and games, form an integral part of B.Ed., training. Attendance for these classes is compulsory as physical education forms a regular part of the B.Ed., curriculum. Absence from games and physical training classes may entertain suspension from attending the University Examination. Each trainee should take two physical Education classes during the Block teaching.

INSTRUCTIONAL CAMPS, TOURS AND VISITS

The educational possibilities of instructional camps, tours and visits are being increasingly recognized, whenever they are organized either by the college or by the respective section, participation is obligatory on the part of the students in order to enrich their formal training.

ADRIEN BRESY LIBRARY

Special Features:

The library is the heart of our institution and well utilized by the student teachers. At present the library houses a collection 6500 books, 20 journals. Library is fully linked through KOHA ILMS Software.

Rules and Regulations:

1. Bonafide students and staff of St. Charles College of Education and the neighboring institution of St. Charles Society, Madurai are allowed to borrow books from the library.
2. Silence must be observed inside the library
3. No property except writing material should be carried inside the library.

4. Do not take out any book, magazine, journal or newspaper from the library without prior permission from the librarian.
5. Do not replace books on the shelf by yourself. Leave them on the reading table.
6. Do not write or make mark on books, journals, magazine or newspaper you read.
7. Do not leave the library when the librarian or attendant is absent.
8. Students are allowed to borrow two books at a time for duration of one week (7 calendar days) renewable for 15 days. Faculties and staffs are advised not to keep any book which is not currently used by them irrespective of permissible time.
9. A fine of Rs. 5/- per day will be imposed on a book submitted after the due date.
10. In case of loss of book by the borrower, the cost of the book (if available in the market) at latest rate will be paid by the borrower or replacement of the book may also be accepted.
11. In case of damage of book or missing pages while in the custody of the borrower, cost of repair (if acceptable) will be borne by the borrower. Otherwise such will be treated as loss (Refer 10).
12. No student is allowed to borrow or keep library book after issue of admit card for ensuring University Examination.

Extension Service

The College encourages students to render their service to the society in different ways, thus the student teachers offer themselves to coach the slow learners of the model schools through free tuitions. Student teachers also pay visit to the home for the aged regularly and listen to the senior citizens. Social projects are undertaken by the staff and students to be in touch with the realities of life. Visit to the special schools helps them in their teaching learning process.

Duration of B. Ed Program

The B.Ed. program shall be for duration of two academic years consisting of four semesters. Each semester is spread over for a period of 100 working days (36 hours in a week - 5 or 6 days in a week), excluding the period of examination and admission.

Curriculum of Program

The B.Ed. program will consist of Compulsory Theory Courses in 'Perspectives in Education', 'Curriculum and Pedagogic Studies' along with Elective Courses, Value Added Courses, and 'Engagement with the Field' as practical components. The curriculum of the B.Ed. program consists of 14 Compulsory Theory Courses and six Elective Courses involving option of any one course along with Engagement with the Field consisting of 16-week School Internship, courses on EPC, and an Online Course.

Note 1: The major objective of the Pedagogic course is to make the student teachers to get an overview of the content of the chosen subject also to get practiced in classroom teaching at Level - I & Level - II.

Level - I is pertaining to standard VI to VIII and is compulsory for all the student teachers to get many-fold experiences in classroom teaching of their pedagogic subject during the School Internship. The Students of Economics, Commerce, Psychology, Philosophy, Sociology, Political Science, Logic, and Indian Culture should study and teach the subject **Social Sciences**, students of Computer Science should study and teach the subject **Mathematics**; and students of Home Science should study and teach the subject **Science** prescribed in the school curriculum at Level -I.

Level - II is pertaining to standard IX and X for undergraduate qualified student teachers and standard XI and XII for post graduate qualified student-teachers. The student-

teachers need to get an overview of their pedagogy subject prescribed in the school curriculum and also to teach their concerned pedagogic subject at Level - II during the School Internship.

Note 2: The EPC records are to be prepared and submitted at the time of practical examination. The EPC records are to be prepared based on the theoretical inputs and practical experiences gained from reading and reflecting on text, performance in drama and art related to teaching and learning process, critical understanding and usage of ICT for effective teaching and learning process, and understanding of the strengths and weaknesses of one's own self.

Medium of Instruction

The candidates admitted into the B.Ed. degree program in the Colleges of Education affiliated to Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University should select the medium of instruction either as English or Tamil (as per the availability of medium of instruction in the Colleges of Education). After the last date of admission, Principals of the Colleges of Education should submit the name list to Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University along with the medium of instruction chosen by each candidate. In case, if the admitted candidates prefer to change their medium of instruction at later stage of the program, it should be permitted only after obtaining necessary written permission from the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, prior to the publication of Nominal Roll.

Medium of instruction chosen by the candidate to pursue the B.Ed. degree program will be indicated in the B.Ed. degree program Transfer Certificate alone. Classroom instruction shall be carried out separately for different medium of instruction in Colleges of Education.

Attendance

1. Each candidate whose admission is approved by Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University should gain 85% of attendance in each semester, failing which he/she will not be permitted to appear for examination. However, as per the decision of the Syndicate of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University in its meeting held on 10.08.2010 candidates who are able to gain attendance only up to 75% on medical ground, shall be permitted to appear for the examination after getting condonation of attendance, adhering to the norms of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University.

2. Student who is continuously absent for ten days or more at any point of time, a showcase notice shall be served

stating that he/she has to forfeit his/her seat, if, he/she fails to report to the College immediately.

3. The student whose attendance is below 70% and more than 40% may be given readmission within a period of two consecutive years with full fee and in such a case the student has to fulfill all the rules and regulations which are followed by a fresh student.

4. The student who does not have adequate attendance shall not be considered for the award of any scholarship or any kind of financial aid by the University/Government/ Quasi Government Agencies/NGOs.

Examinations

Each candidate whose admission is approved by Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University only permitted for written and practical examinations. Candidates who have failed to satisfy the minimum attendance norms of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University in each semester will not be permitted to appear for the written examination and or practical examinations.

The term-end external examination for all semesters shall be conducted by the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University at the end of each semester. The written examination for each theory course shall be conducted for 70 marks.

The award of continuous comprehensive evaluation (i.e. internal assessment) marks in each semester for theory courses shall be distributed as follows:

Appearance for the Examinations

Each candidate whose admission is approved by Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University shall apply for the written/practical examinations. Candidates who have failed to satisfy the minimum attendance norms of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University will not be permitted to appear for the written/practical examinations. However, the basis of permitting a student to appear for the examination shall be in accordance with the Regulations of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, in force from time to time.

Passing Minimum for Internal Assessment

In case a candidate secures less than 50% of marks prescribed for the internal assessment, then one more opportunity shall be given to him/her to improve the internal marks in the specific course within the next semester.

Reappearance for Theory Courses

Students who have secured 'F' (Fail)/Ab (Absent in the examination) grade in a particular course (other than the practicum components) can reappear during the subsequent end-semester examination. All applicable fees shall be charged for the purpose of re-appearance in (Theory Courses) examinations. Each unsuccessful candidate after the completion of the two academic years/four semesters shall be permitted to reappear for the written examinations within the next three consecutive academic years.

Provisions for Improvement

- i) A candidate who passed in all the courses of a semester shall be permitted to improve the results by reappearing for the whole examination (All Theory Courses) in the next semester only.

- ii) A candidate shall be permitted to apply for improvement of examinations 30 days in advance of the pertinent semester examination whenever held.
- iii) If a candidate passes all the courses in reappearance, higher of the two aggregate marks secured by the candidate shall be awarded for that semester. In case the candidate fails in the reappearance for improvement, the marks secured by the candidate in the first appearance will prevail.
- iv) A candidate who appeared for improvements is eligible for reclassification of class only and will not be considered for ranking purpose.
- v) Improvement is applicable only for theory examinations and not applicable for practicum components.

Transitory Regulations

Whenever a course or scheme of instruction is changed in a particular academic year, examination for three more years shall be conducted immediately following thereafter according to the old regulations/syllabus. Candidates who failed to appear for the examinations or unsuccessful in the examinations shall redo the program and take the examination in accordance with the Regulations and Syllabus of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, in force from time to time.

Passing Minimum for Written Examination

Each candidate who appears for the written examination shall be declared to have passed the written examination only if he/she secures not less than 50% of marks in aggregate in each theory course with a minimum of 45% of marks in the external examination in each theory course. All other candidates shall be deemed to have failed in the written examination. A candidate who fails in one or more theory courses in the written examination shall be permitted to appear again only for those courses in which he/she failed.

Practical Examination

Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University will conduct practical examination after the successful completion of 16 weeks of School Internship during the third semester. Practical examination shall be normally conducted at the end of third semester. A panel consisting of two external members appointed by the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University will assess the teaching competency of each candidate and also his/her practical works, records, and instructional materials.

Passing Minimum for Practical Examination

Candidates who have secured not less than 50% in each of the practical components for which the weightage is given shall be deemed to have passed in the practical examination. Others will be treated as unsuccessful candidates in the practical examination.

All the records related to the practical components should be made available to the duly appointed Practical Examination Board at the time of practical examination and the marks awarded by the Practical Examination Board, is final.

Reappearance for Practical Examination

Each unsuccessful candidate shall be permitted to reappear for the practical examination within the next three consecutive academic years, whenever the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University schedules the practical examination.

Eligibility for the Award of Degree

A student shall be declared to be eligible for the award of Degree of Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) provided that the student has successfully completed the requirements of the B.Ed. program of study and has passed all the prescribed examinations in all the four semesters within a maximum period of FIVE YEARS reckoned from the commencement of first semester to which the candidate was admitted.

Classification of Successful Candidates

The results of successful candidates at the end of all four semesters shall be classified on the basis of aggregate percentage of marks obtained in all the semesters and the aggregate or Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) for the award of Degree of Bachelor of Education.

Class/Distinction shall be awarded to the candidates after they successfully complete the B.Ed. Program as per the norms specified below:

Grading System

Assigning Grades for Successful Candidates

Each semester result shall also be declared in terms of grades.

A six point grading system which is based on the actual absolute marks scored and alpha-sign grade as described below shall be adopted for successful/unsuccessful candidates.

The semester Grade Point Average (GPA) shall be computed by dividing the sum of the Grade Point Weights (GPW) of all the courses of the study by the maximum credits for the semester. The Grade Point Weights are in turn calculated as the product of the grade points earned in the respective courses and the credits assigned to that course. The maximum total marks for each course of study is 100, while the credit assigned is 5 (five).

The Aggregate or Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) at the end of all the semester examinations shall be calculated as the weighted average of the semester grade point averages. The CGPA is obtained by dividing the total of semester credit weightages by the maximum credits assigned for the program.

Explanation

Alpha-Sign Grades A+, A, B, C and D denotes successful completion of the program. The Grade 'F' denotes failed in the program and requires for reappearance in the examination. The Grade 'Ab' denotes the student's absent for the examination.

Ranking Procedure

A candidate who passes all the semester examinations in the first attempt are only eligible for ranks provided they secure at least CGPA of 6.0 or Alpha-Sign Grade 'C'.

A candidate who passes the semester examinations in parts is eligible for only classification of Class/ CGPA and Alpha-Sign Grade, but not for ranking.

**“We teach more with our life than
with our lips”**

- A good teacher is also a good learner. The day he / she stops to learn, he / she ceases to be an effective teacher.
- A teacher reaches punctuality to the students by being punctual himself / herself.
- Praise and rewards of the teacher yield better results than punishments and blame.
- Good results are achieved by the teachers only if they conscientiously work hard.
- The teacher is effective when he / she loves the students genuinely.
- The oath of honesty to be faithful in performing his / her duties diligently, taken by the teacher makes her / him an effective teacher.
- The teacher should carefully observe the physical appearance of the students regarding their dress, speech, gestures because these reveal the character of the students.
- Education of a girl is more important than the education of boys, since she is the queen of the home.
- Studying with a pen in hand helps one's concentration during study and necessary for remembering.
- An effective teacher should get the active and full co-operation of the parents in the education of their students.
