# STUDENT ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME

Enrichment programmes are often interactive and project-focused. It enhances a student's education by bringing new concepts to light or by using old concepts in new ways. These activities are fun for the student, but they also impart knowledge. An enrichment activity can be any activity that promotes critical thinking, listening, memorization, visualization and concentration. The activities themselves should try to approach the varied interests of the students and involve Communicative English, Computer Technology, Physical Education and Games, Singing, Science Experiments and Art activities. The purpose of enrichment activities are to enhance the educational learning being done in the classroom. The following programmes were arranged to enrich our student-teachers.

## COMMUNICATIVE ENGLISH CLASS

*"Kind Words can be Short and Easy to Speak, but their Echoes are Truly Endless."* – Mother Theresa

Our institution arranged for Communicative English Classes from 6<sup>th</sup> July, 2019 for our student-teachers. Rev.Fr. Samson Raja, Research Scholar, Loyola College presented methods of teaching English, effective communication skills, vocabulary, and syllabus analysis. In today's age, having solid English skills is a must. It's becoming the language of the world and all of us got keep up. Luckily, with a little perseverance and dedication, it's now easier than ever to improve our English skills. Effective communication is necessary in almost every field of life. Good communication is required to do everything from performing a job properly to ensuring a romantic relationship functions smoothly. Human connection is important for everyone. Some people are highly motivated by this connection and want to be popular with many people. In order to achieve this, they need to have good communication skills.

The student-teachers were very much motivated by the interactive and participative classes. Our student-teachers got the knowledge about English proficiency and mastery of the academic language. The following outcomes have been observed from our student-teachers.

- Increased motivation to learn
- Improved self-confidence
- Reduced anxiety about academic readiness
- Stronger peer relationships, especially among those who share a common interest
- Experience with hands-on activities
- Experience engaging in high level discussion with other motivated students.



## ENGLISH BASIC TO FLUENCY COURSE

From 8<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> of July, 2019, English Basic to Fluency Course was organized for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year students. Br. Raphael, English language trainer from Kerala was the Resource Person. The English syllabus is organized around both vocabulary and grammar structures. Since a certain number of classes is allotted for each item in the syllabus, teachers usually have the necessary time to insist on teaching and practicing vocabulary.

This English Basic to Fluency course had the following outcomes being observed from student-teachers;

- Teach the patterns of English for reading or writing
- Offer a comprehensive spelling program, scientific spelling
- Educate teachers in the development of a fluency program as well as a program that develops oral language and listening comprehension.
- Train student-teachers to implement a curriculum that employ a multisensory research-based approach to reading, writing and spelling.
- Facilitate the creation of early intervention and prevention programs.
- Support teachers by giving them the tools necessary to reach additional students with reading difficulties.



## FIRST YEAR STUDENTS (2019-2020 Batches)

### Two Day Workshop on “English Language Training”

On 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2019, a Two-Day English Language Training Workshop was conducted by Rev.Fr. Samson Raja, Research Scholar, Loyola College, Chennai. He presented that the ability to speak English comes with the benefit of access to the global world. English language has put India in the global market. The individual as well as the economy benefit from the use of English language.

English language helps us connect at a global level. International trade, academic exchange, cultural exchange and many others have been enabled and improved by English language. The following outcomes have been observed from our student-teachers.

- Inculcated the proficiency skills.
- Feelings of belonging to a larger community of language profession students.
- Increased persistence and resilience.
- Access to advanced coursework in the English Grammar.
- Enhanced interpersonal skills.
- Learning at a much higher level academically and socially than typical college courses allow.
- Teaching academic writing.
- Teaching reading strategies for secondary level students.



## ICT SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING

Our institution arranged ICT Skill Development Classes from 3<sup>rd</sup> of August to 13<sup>th</sup> of August, 2019, for our student-teachers. From 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> August, 2019, Digital Literacy Class was arranged by our institution. Mr. Vigneshwaran and Mr. Saravanakumar, Literacy trainers, were the Resource Persons. Our Resource Persons gave hands-on training on basic digital literacy skills. On 12<sup>th</sup> October, 2019, a one-day seminar on "Google Classroom" was organized in our college. Dr. P.Vishvanathan, Assistant Professor, Thiagarajar College of Preceptors, was the Resource Person. He gave a training on Google apps. On 13<sup>th</sup> August, 2019, a session on Technology in Teaching and Learning was conducted by Ms. Logarubini, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Commerce, Madura College..

The classes lasted for 11 days and the student-teachers were very much motivated by the interactive and participative classes. Our student-teachers acquired the knowledge of ICT Skills and mastery of computer technology. The following classes were arranged to our student-teachers.

### DIGITAL LITERACY CLASS

From 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> August, 2019, Digital Literacy Class was conducted Mr.Vigneshwaran, ICT Trainer. He presented the ability to understand and make use of digital technologies. In the modern world, this is increasingly important, as the Internet and digital technology is slowly becoming an essential component of many students' lives. This Digital Technology Classes our student-teachers participated had the following outcomes.

- Microsoft tools and resources that help the students, teach, assess, track, and analyze.
- Classroom is also compatible with numerous applications that student-teachers can add to their profiles to improve lesson plans.
- Workbench, an online platform focused on arts, science, technology, and math education content, where student-teachers can create and share lesson plans.
- Collaboration between students and teachers can be a great way to understand which program may be the best fit.
- The innovative teaching methods that arm our student.



## ONE DAY SEMINAR ON GOOGLE CLASSROOM

On 12<sup>th</sup> October, 2019, a one-day Seminar on "Google Classroom" was organized in our college. Dr. P. Vishvanathan, Assistant Professor, Thiagarajar college of Preceptors, was the Resource Person. He presented Google Drive applications through Mobile App, Text App, Text Fairy, Speak and Translate, Plant App, Kahoot Game, My mine App, Game Scanner, Photo Math, English Grammar, English Listening and Speaking, Quiz Vocabulary. The following outcomes have been observed from our student-teachers.

- Use fostered collaboration and increased apps.
- Imagine to be equally desirable in all the subjects.
- These apps and collaboration, in turn, led to quality learning, as evidenced by both the students' own experiences and the reflections of the teachers.



## TECHNOLOGY IN TEACHING AND LEARNING

*"ICT is not the future of our children's education, it is the present and we need to make investment in ICT now!" - National Association of Advisors for Computer in Education.*

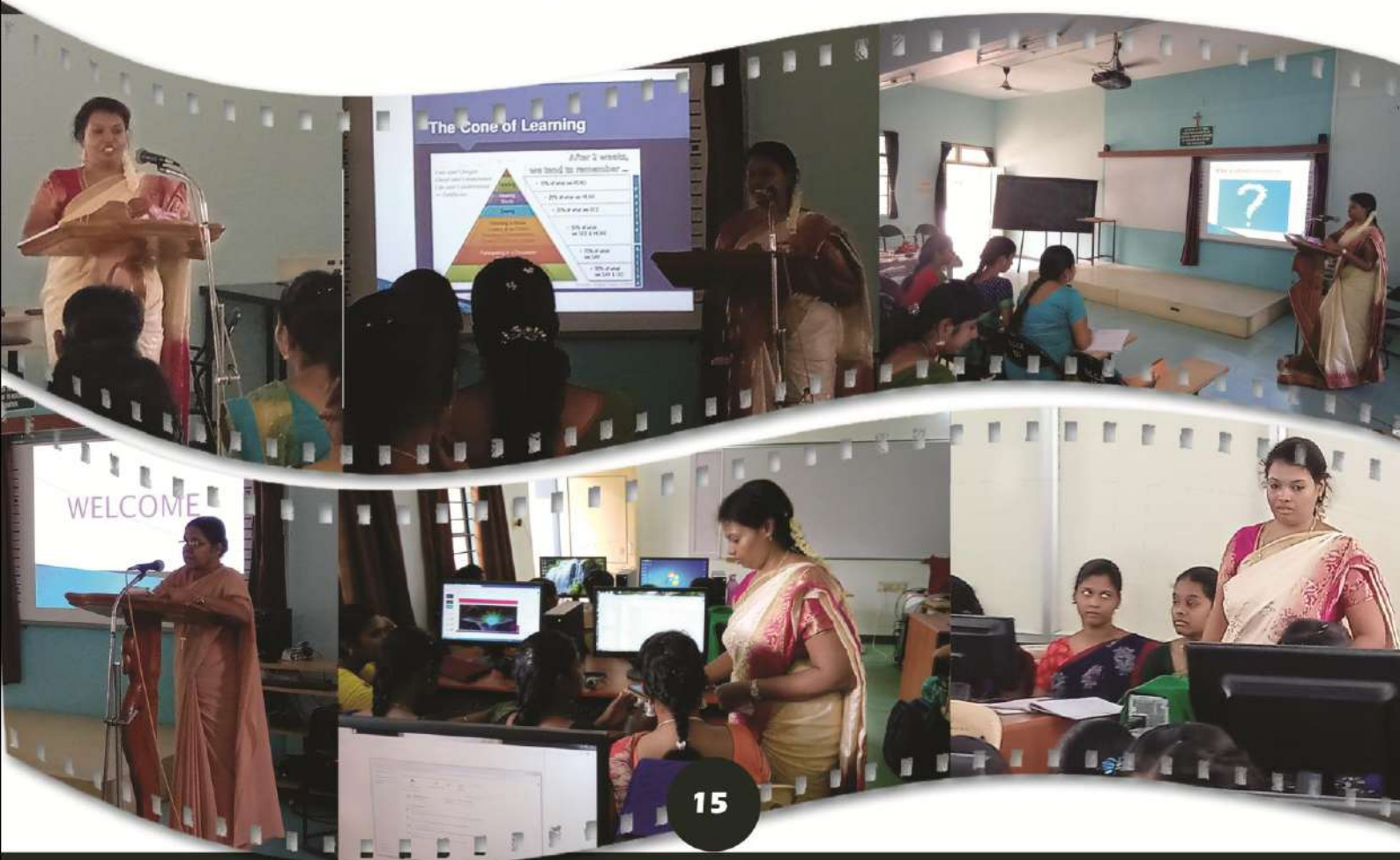
On 13<sup>th</sup> August, 2019, a session on Technology in Teaching and Learning was conducted by Ms. Logarubini, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Commerce, Madura College. She presented that technology is a systematic application of relevant technological processes and resources in teaching, with a goal to improve students' performance. Our student-teachers acquired knowledge about Educational technology. The following outcomes have been observed from our student-teachers.

- Use software relating to assessment, game-based learning and student collaboration than participants who reported lower achievement.
- A student-teacher's view on how learning works relates to success outcomes.
- Evidence suggests the importance of software, even over hardware when trying to achieve success.
- Interactive front-of-room display hardware outperforms projectors.

### BRIDGE COURSE ORIENTATION

*"Since we live in an age of innovation, a practical education must prepare a man for work that does not yet exist and cannot yet be clearly defined." – Peter F. Drucker*

A bridging course is an academic curriculum that is offered to mature students as a means of preparing for the intellectual challenges of a university education, successful completion of which is recognized as a basis of admission to the college or University. It is aimed to act as a buffer for the new entrants, with an objective to provide adequate time for the transition to hard-core teacher's courses. During this interaction of 12 days with our faculty and the student-teachers had equipped themselves with the knowledge and the confidence needed to take on bigger challenges as future teachers of this country. The following classes were arranged for our student-teachers.



## CALLIGRAPHY AND HANDWRITING CLASS

From 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> August, 2019, Calligraphy and Handwriting classes were conducted. Rev. Sr. Sabina Jose, Secretary, SCCE, was the Resource Person. She presented that calligraphy and handwriting is important because it improves writing skills, communication skills, creative thinking and creativity. This writing skill helps the writer express his feelings and thoughts to other people in a relatively permanent form. This class had the following outcomes in our student-teachers;

- Writing about a topic improves the student's understanding of the topic, and papers with a slant help the students understand how to successfully construct professional arguments and debates about a topic.
- Learning how to structure arguments and articulate opinions in writing translates well to the spoken word thus helping students to be better in presenting facts and opinions in a rational way.

## HOLISTIC HEALTH CLASS

On 7<sup>th</sup> August, 2019, a session on Holistic Health was conducted. Sr. Gracy SCB, was the Resource Person. She presented that the Holistic health assessments are integral components of patient care. It is used by nurses to evaluate how each area - body, mind and spirit - is affecting the patient's overall health. It's a wellness approach that addresses the body, mind and spirit or the physical, emotional/mental and spiritual aspects of an individual. The following outcomes have been observed from our student-teachers.

- Conduct a through physical examination (body).
- Encourage to share their concerns about their condition (mind).
- Beliefs, spiritual or religious, and how they have affected their faith (spirit).
- Importance of health and yoga.
- Improve body-mind relaxation.
- Reduce conflict and anxiety.
- Improve emotional maturity.



## CREATIVE ARTS CLASS

In the Afternoon session (07.08.2019), Creative Arts Class was conducted by Dr. Aruna Sankara Velayutham, Associate Professor, SCCE. She presented that creative arts which play an important role in the development of students. It serves as a means of expression and relaxation. Students improve their fine motor skills by learning to manipulate a paintbrush. By counting pieces and colours, they learn the basics of all subjects. This creative arts class had the following outcomes in our student-teachers;

- Students developed knowledge and understanding, skills, values and attitudes.
- In Drama, students developed knowledge and understanding, skills, values and attitudes in making, performing and appreciating and by engaging with roles, dramatic contexts, elements and forms.
- In Dance, students developed knowledge and understanding, skills, values and attitudes in performing, composing, appreciating and by engaging with the elements of dance through a range of contexts.
- They developed emotional self-regulation and self-control and the ability to control emotions.
- Creative art helped in boosting their creativity and self-confidence.



## CITIZENSHIP TRAINING CAMP ACTIVITIES

The following outcomes have been observed from our student-teachers.

- Enhanced Consumer Rights Awareness.
- Developed Environmental Awareness.
- Motivated Eye Donation, Blood Donation and Organ Donation.
- Gained the knowledge about awareness on sexual harassment.
- Developed self-confidence of the student-teachers.
- Understand the importance of the SUPW activities.
- Gained knowledge about value-added products from villages.
- Improved the democratic ideas of student-teachers.
- Developed the social responsibility of student-teachers.

It demands understanding with investigative minds, assimilating the required transformations, accommodating and responding to the universal needs. We also need to train teachers with new perspectives as the outer world is brought into the classroom and schools are opening to the world.

Our Institution thus stimulates the prospective teachers with various practices related to curricular and co-curricular areas. A best practice is a method or technique that has been generally accepted as superior to any alternatives because it produces results that are superior to those achieved by other means or because it has become a standard way of doing things. Following are the best practices that are inculcated in our student-teachers.

## 1) ACTION RESEARCH

Action research creates knowledge based on the interaction with the target group and scrutinizes for a positive approach. It provides prospective teachers the opportunity to improve their teaching and make forth teaching learning process effective. It offers a teacher the opportunity to investigate, question and do reasoning to their teaching practice and their students learning.

Our student-teachers conducted the action research on "Problem faced by the primary school students while second language learning and its remedial measures" at St. Charles Primary School, Thanakankulam. Prospective teachers visited the primary schools and observed the reading and writing skills of students from class one to fifth periodically. Most of the students had problem while reading and writing from their text book. For example, some students were unable to pronounce the words appropriately, some had difficulty in identifying letters and writing even simple texts. Prospective teachers consulted their respective class teachers and finally their headmistress after identifying the problems the students faced while reading and writing English language. Prospective teachers consulted language experts and planned remedial measures to overcome the problem.

Student-teachers then grouped themselves and came out with various counter measures to effectively teach the second language with aids like computer based teaching, visual objects, puppet shows and games based on language. This was constructively implemented on the students thereon. After completing the activities students were evaluated through with LSRW concept for monitoring their improvement in their language proficiency.

Based on the evaluation, it was observed that the reading and writing skills of the students had improved a lot. This action research had stimulated our budding teachers to conduct the research and solve their class room problems and enhance their research skills.



## 2) ORIENTATION FOR PAPER PRESENTATION

A good teacher becomes a substantial scholar with frequent publications. Frequent research publications by an individual will result in increasing the researcher's credibility. A number of recruiters, institutions, look for individuals who have done ample researches and published those in journals.

The significance of research publications is immense. The right way to publish is to start properly. One has to conceive an idea, submit a proposal, get clearances from the board, research, finish the paper, and then publish. Our institution arranged a workshop on developing paper presentation skills. Mr. B. P. Pereira, Speech Point, Madurai who has edited numerous journals and books served as the Resource Person.

He oriented and gave hands-on training on how to write and present a paper. He imparted a great deal of knowledge on our students on do's and don'ts whilst constructing a research paper. The structure of the paper, Abstract, Introduction, the Importance of the research paper, Research Questions, Chapter Outlines, Literature Review, Methodology of the Research, Research Results, Discussion, Inference, Bibliography and Citations were clearly characterized by him.

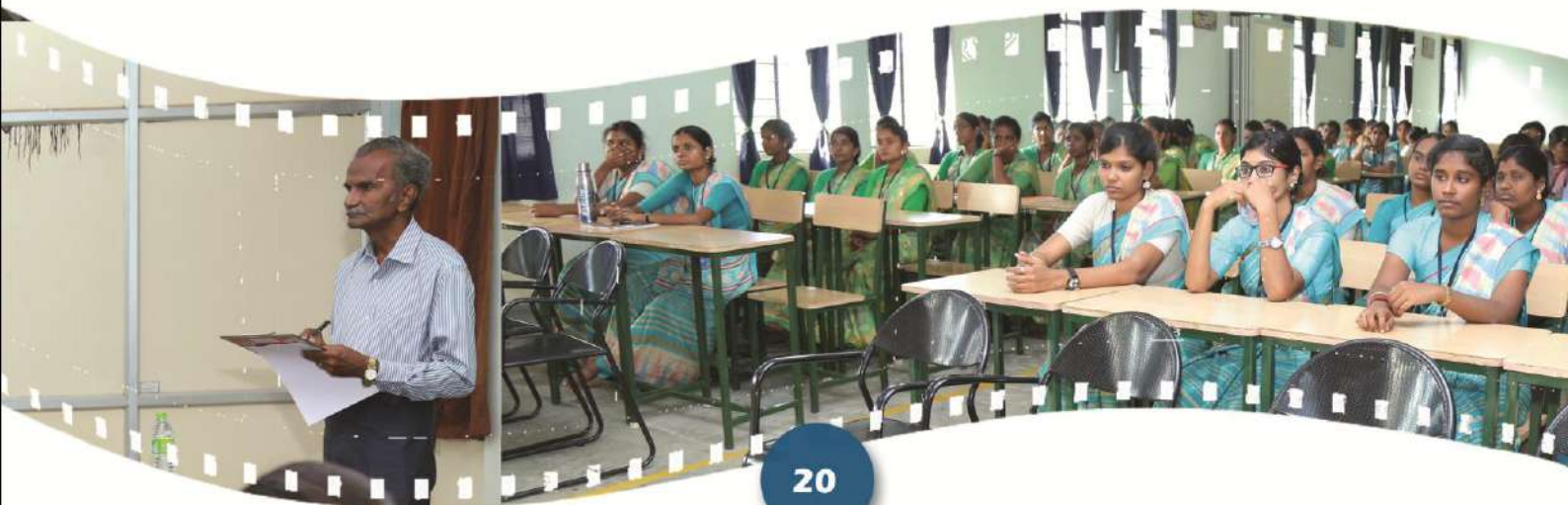
Publication/ presentation is very important in the academic career of our student-teachers as researches provide them with information and knowledge. It improvises our budding teacher's research skills. Publications/ presentations added value to our prospective teachers who are in the researching and educational field. It provides a million of perspectives about one single topic presentation of our student-teachers.

## 3) GANDHIAN THOUGHT EXAM

How relevant is Mahatma Gandhi in the 21<sup>st</sup> century? Mashelkar has said "... not just a mere collection of thoughts. Collectively, it is the road map, or the way of life; it is the anchor for a youngster in search of inspiration". Our institution offers the "Gandhian Thoughts" as a compulsory value-added course in partnership with Gandhi Research Foundation, Gandhi Museum, Madurai. More than ever before, Gandhiji's teachings are valid today, when people are trying to find solutions to the rampant greed, widespread violence, and runaway consumptive style of living.

Youth today is indiscriminately bombarded with negative emotions of selfishness, hatred, vengeance and violence through T.V., mobile and video games. Gandhiji's life and literature is still the best source of inspiration for our student-teachers to inculcate the values of love, brotherhood, truth, friendship, service, tolerance, non-violence and fearlessness into the next generation and it motivates them to look upon non-violent means for conflict resolution.

With this in mind, our budding teachers appeared for Gandhian thoughts examination. Gandhiji was always a philosopher and his philosophy was always practical and down to earth.



#### 4) TAMILNADU SCIENCE FORUM (TNSF) MEMBERSHIP

Science placed before humanity plays a tool which transforms society, a tool that banishes poverty, disease and social backwardness. But for it to be used for such purposes, awareness of the potential of science and technology, and a scientific temperament should become an integral part of the life process of the people. Our institution is enrolled as a member in Tamilnadu Science Forum.

All management members, faculty members, student-teachers and administrative staff are enrolled. We created this opportunity for our student-teachers,

- To provide an independent forum for regular meetings, seminars and workshops on themes of current interest for all those interested in science and technology.
- To encourage and assist the formation and development of science associations, science clubs, etc.
- To encourage interaction among scientists, science educators, science writers and others interested in promoting, communicating and popularizing science.
- To investigate and discuss important areas and issues in science and technology including the relationship between science, society and policy.
- To assemble a body of information focusing on the main currents and trends of the scientific and technological revolution.
- To develop functional capabilities amongst weaker sections of the society so as to improve their livelihood options or better their income earning capabilities.

Our institution has also subscribed to receive science magazines and journals like Thulir Magazine (monthly), Jantar Mantar Magazine (bi-monthly) and Vizhutu Magazine (bi-monthly) to be updated on science. This movement serves the community and helps in the betterment of their life. Being a member of this forum we receive a monthly magazine titled Vigyana Siragu.



## 5) TRADITIONAL GAMES

Playing games can contribute to children's learning. Traditional games are non-digital, informal games, unlike the latest ones that have more commercial interest, for example, hide and seek. Traditional games can be used to enhance learning activities, for example: Interactive problem solving challenges.

Our institution conducted an educational case study and introduced few traditional games into the student-teachers, attempting to bring together the benefits of playing traditional outdoor games.

The objectives of this programme is to target the educational outcomes while having a strong consideration of the social and emotional aspects of students regarding motivation, joy, positive upbringing patterns and connection to the traditional values expressed in our folklore. We selected some traditional games and introduced them into the regular curricula of Maths, Art and Nature/Society to our prospective teachers.

Each game was carefully selected aiming to improve certain aspect of the learning process with regard to the individual differences in personality, learning style and ability of each student. The games were "*Pallanguzhi*" and "*Thayam/Aadu Pulli Aattam*" "*Nondi Vilayaattu*".

The game-based learning scenario encouraged active participation of all the students in the games, collaboration, and cooperative work in problem solving tasks given during and after the games, active participation of the students in the evaluation process, development of critical thinking, and praising the friendship during the joyful learning activities.

The effects of the selected games on educational outcomes were investigated using multiple criteria including evaluation of the academic performance and overall estimation of the transferable skills as communication, collaboration and interactivity.

The correlation between individual factors like personality, learning style and experienced satisfaction, and difference were observed. The observations showed that students' achievements were directly influenced by students' intrinsic and extrinsic motivational factors, as well as perceived experience.

Additionally, the integration of traditional games in the classroom was equally accepted among all students. Still, the link between the students' personality dimensions and motivation revealed that introvert children might have slightly increased motivation and possibility to open up during indoor games in such collaborative environments.



## COMMUNITY BASED ACTIVITIES

- Sr. Catherine

The college extends its help to the community through the Extension Service Cell members and Rotaract Club who have drafted the activities for the year to be carried out. As per the plan the Extension Service Cell motivates the student-teachers to visit the old age home (Sneha Illam) in the campus, encourages the students to talk to the abandoned old people to know their problems and to have regard and respect for the aged. Thus the cell provides opportunity for the student-teachers to celebrate festivals like Christmas and Pongal with them and to cheer them up on 'Elders day' with cultural programme and gifts.

### ACTIVITIES FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

On 28<sup>th</sup> Sept. 2019, the Extension Service Cell organized 'Elders Day' celebrations. Our student-teachers took active part in arranging the cultural programmes and gifts for the grannies of the Sneha Illam. Mrs Sharmila (Alumna, SCCE), BT. Asst. Sowrashtra GHSS was the chief guest of the day who cheered the grannies with her affectionate talk. Sr. Rosaline, Sr. Sabina Jose and Sr. Catherine joined the celebration and greeted the elders. Student-teachers entertained the grannies and distributed sweets and gifts. Grannies were elated with the students' performances. The students' union members visited the grannies before Christmas and wished all of them with a cake.

On 18<sup>th</sup> of Jan. 2019, St Charles College of Education celebrated 'Pongal' with grannies of Sneha Illam (old age home in the campus). All student-teachers participated in decorating Sneha Illam with beautiful rangoli and presented cultural programmes to the grannies. Mrs. Glory Debora, Social Activist (New Creation Trust) was the chief guest. Rev. Sr. Josephine Nirmala, General Counselor, was the Guest of Honour and Sr. Amirtham, Sr. Rosaline, Sr. Sabina Jose and Sr. Mary Catherine graced the occasion. Our staff and students distributed sweet pongal and sugarcane to the grannies and to all the invitees. Everybody enjoyed the day with the grannies. Hostellers visit grannies on special occasions, like Birthdays, talk to them and get their blessings and distribute sweets to them. Grannies also feel very happy to share their problems with the student-teachers.



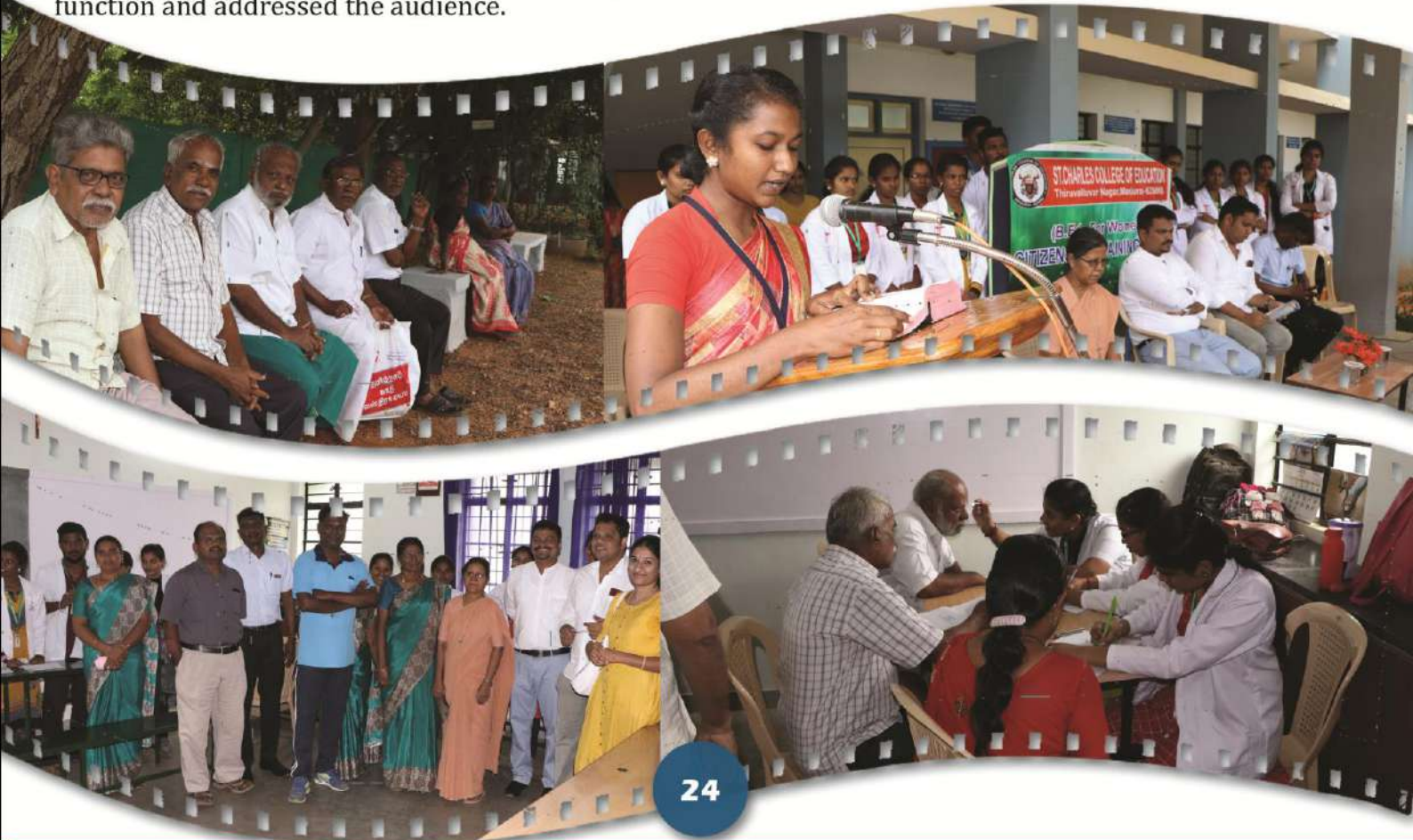
## EYE SCREENING CAMP

Nedumaran and Mrs. A. Packiam, co-ordinators of the CT Camp, introduced the proceedings of the day. Dr. Lingeshwaran, an eye specialist, spoke on eye-care and importance of eyes in our life. The student-teachers under the guidance of the faculty members assisted in the eye screening camp. Trainee students from Annai Optometry College and about 6 staff members conducted the eye screening for the people present. About fifty patients from the locality availed this eye screening opportunity. Hats-off to Mr. Ruban Thomas, Alumni, St. Charles Matric. Hr. Sec. School, Madurai, who donated power glasses for those who required the same. This eye screening camp was of great help to the poor of the locality.

## SUMMER CAMP

Rotaract Club and Extension Cell conduct summer camp every year as part of their programme to teach the students of the locality how to spend the holidays usefully. The student-teachers and the faculty members organize the programmes so as to help the students to learn basic skills of learning, and art and crafts for their future. Yoga, prayer, reading, writing, Fun with Maths, teaching recreational songs, drawing, storytelling, etc., are the usual activities of the camp. This year the summer camp was conducted for five days from 22<sup>nd</sup> April - 27<sup>th</sup> 2019.

Sr. Mary Catherine, camp-in-charge, invoked God's blessings. Sr. Fatima, Sr. Amala Garden, Sr. Amirtham and Sr. Sabina Jose, Secretary, graced the function. The camp activity began with registration of the children of the locality and students of our St. Charles Primary and Higher Secondary School. There were altogether fifty participants. The students were given the files, each with copies of recreational songs, and crayons were distributed to the students for drawing. The Resource Person for the camp was Dr. Aruna Sankara Velayudam, Asst Professor, St. Charles College of Education, Madurai. Mrs. K. Amuthavalli Asst. Prof. in Tamil provided assistance by conducting 'Fun with Maths' and handwriting classes throughout the camp. Other activities conducted were, competitions in singing and dancing. An exhibition of the arts and crafts prepared during the camp and drawings of the participants was organized on the last day of the camp. Valedictory function was held on 26<sup>th</sup> April 2019 at 10.30 am. The chief guest of the day was Mr. Kannan from Rotary club who had been deputed by Mr. Gandhi, President, Rotary Club, Madurai Downtown, distributed the gifts (pouches) to all the participants. The primary school students entertained the audience by their action song and the high school students by their group song and group dance. Dr. Aruna Sankara Velayudam, presided over the function and addressed the audience.



## AWARENESS RALLY

One of the highlights of the Citizenship Training camp is the awareness rally arranged in order to disseminate the theme of the day to the people of the locality and conscience them of their rights and responsibilities towards the society and the community, and to imbibe social, moral and cultural values.

Accordingly, our student-teachers participate actively with full spirit carrying banners and placards with slogans in the streets of Thanakkankulam and Srinivasa colony every day in the evening between 4-5 pm on various awareness rallies, like AIDS awareness, Human Rights awareness, Consumer Rights awareness, Environmental awareness, Eye Donation and Blood Donation awareness, and awareness and prevention of Sexual Harassment .

I'm sure our student-teachers would have discovered for themselves something worthwhile and not as what Isaac Newton would say "I seem to have been only like a boy playing on the seashore and diverting myself in now and then finding a smoother pebble or a prettier shell than ordinary, whilst the great of truth lay all undiscovered before me".

## VISIT TO MOTTAMALAI

We, the sisters and hostellers, visited Mottamalai where few families of gypsies live. We visit them frequently to cheer them up. Our student-teachers teach the small children few recreational songs and distribute sweets to them.

The people on the hill are very hard working, they go out selling beads and articles, like cords, chains, etc. which they themselves make. The visits help our student-teachers to know the hardship of the people and their struggle for water and food and thus know the value of life.

On 19<sup>th</sup> February, 2020 our Student-teachers visited two special schools namely Leonard school for hearing impaired and St. Joseph's school for the blind under the guidance of two assistant professors. The purpose of the visit was to observe their curriculum, methodology of teaching, students care, infrastructure and innovations.

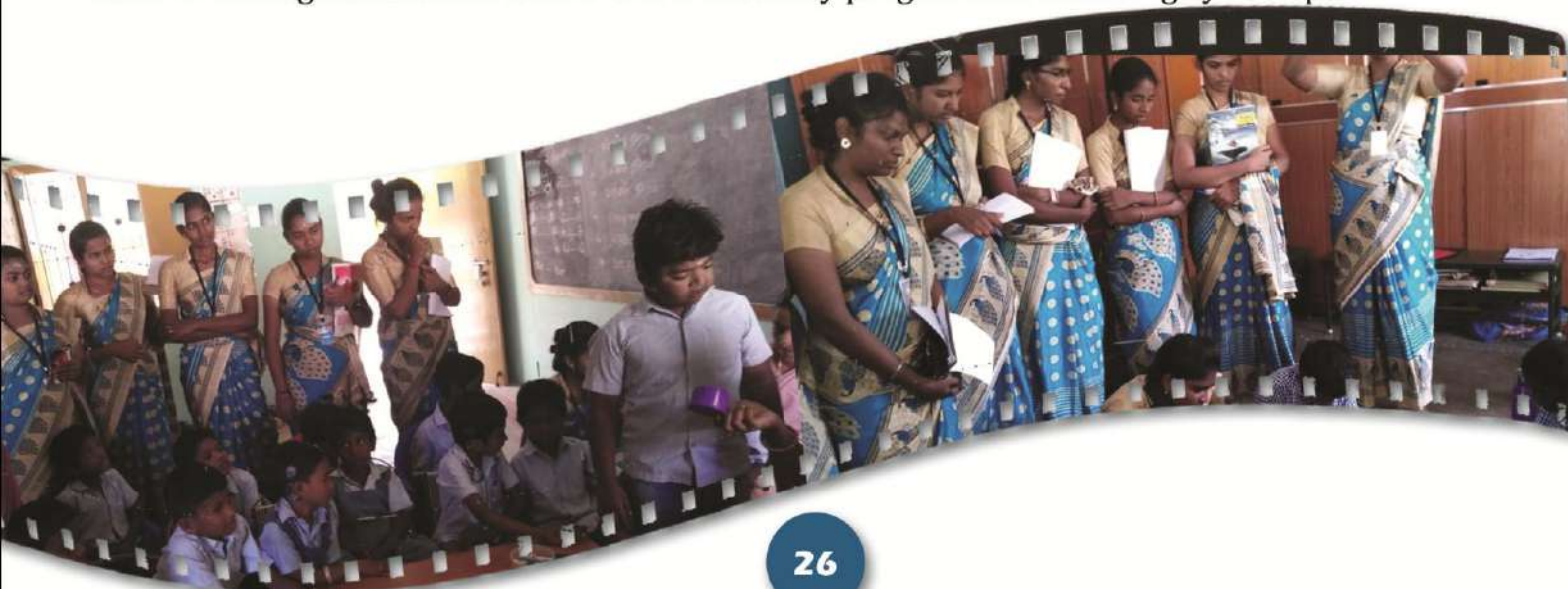
#### LEONARD SCHOOL FOR HEARING IMPAIRED

The Leonard School for Hearing Impaired is situated at Virahanur – Mathagu Anai, Madurai. The school was established in 1991 and is run by the Sisters of CIC, Madurai. The objective of the school was to provide total rehabilitation to persons with Sensory (hearing, vision), Physical and Mental disabilities. Thirteen teachers are working for a student-strength of nearly 80 over there. It was an eco-friendly campus containing seven classrooms provided with all basic facilities. The classes start from EIC and go up to VIII standard. The management provides free education for the children of up to age 6.

The seating arrangements are in U-shape to provide individual care to the students. The school follows Samacheer kalvi syllabus and the exam pattern is the same as other regular schools. Their medium of education is Tamil as it is difficult for those students to learn bilingually. But Basic English and Computer knowledge were provided to them. Students learn through sounds and lip movements of the teacher, and hence the method of teaching was quite slow. The students are guided by both teachers and parents during classroom and extracurricular activities.

#### ST. JOSEPH'S SCHOOL FOR THE BLIND

The St. Joseph's School for the Blind was founded in 1972 at Paravai, Madurai and is managed by the congregation of Mother of Sorrows, Servant of Mary. The continuous effort for the past 48 years has brought up a residential school for the children with visible impairment. The school offers education as per the government syllabus, from I to VIII standards. A special focus on arts like music and crafts has provided them opportunity to explore their talents. Furthermore, they use Braille computer labs which include a Braille printer, specialised software serving their needs to operate normal computers, a talking library with Braille study books and recordings, a playground and a stage for cultural programme. The students stay in a pleasant environment and enjoyed good care, quality food, proper sanitation and medical services. The school aims to form independent and confident individuals. A strong connection to parents is maintained, they too were invited for regular meetings. Furthermore, they aim to be of benefit to as many blind children through awareness events and community programmes including eye camps.



## FIELD TRIP

On 18<sup>th</sup> February, 2020 our student-teachers of St. Charles College of Education were taken on an educational field trip to Meenakshi Amman temple, Thirumalai Nayak Mahal and Samanar caves. Our Physical director Mr. P. Nedumaran and Asst. Professor Mrs. K. Amudhavalli accompanied the students.

Meenakshi Amman temple is one of the most famous pilgrimage sites in India. This architectural masterpiece is the finest example of Dravidian style of architecture. The students were seized on architectural beauty and engineering techniques of the temple. The students gained the knowledge about the history of the temple, the entrances, the gopuras and the statues. Many Mandapams like Aaiyiram Kaal Mandapam, Killi Kootu Mandapam, Ashta Sakthi Mandapam had their own history and were some of the attractions of the temple. The students were astonished to find that in a particular corridor wherever they moved about it appeared that the lingam also moved along with them. Every part of the temple and their compelling sculptures, drawings, paintings, stone inscriptions, golden lotus and serenity of the religious piousness mesmerized everyone.

Another artistic blend of the Dravidian and the Islamic styles is the Thirumalai Nayakar Mahal. Over there, students got to know about the history of the king Thirumalai Nayakar and about the palace. The huge dimension of pillars were built with foliated brickwork, while the polished texture was from the combination of chunam with egg white.

The interiors of this palace mesmerises everyone with its intricate paintings and sculpting. Paintings on the roof of the palace are worth noticing. Currently, only a part of the ruined palace, remains. Students also visited the museum which has a collection of statues, historic paintings, weapons used in olden days.

Students also visited the Samanar caves, which is located at Keelakuyilkudi village, Madurai. It is a hill complex revered for its historical and cultural significance. At the Samanar caves the students observed the lifestyle of Jains and the growth of Tamil literature during the period of Jainism. The students saw the sculptured Jain rocks and the stairs to witness the cave where the Samanars lived. The inscriptions of Tamil and Kannada gave a lot of insight into the history of location as well as the way of their living and the rules that they followed. It was an excellent exposure for all the students visiting the historical and cultural places which are very familiar in Madurai district.

On 24/1/ 2020, three students of St. Charles College of Education visited CSI college of Education, Pasumalai, Madurai. The college conducted a competition for the student-teachers. The purpose of this competition was to identify the best teacher and honour them with an award. Our students Ms. X. A Nilofar, Ms. A. Yagamathy and Mrs. Synthia participated in the contest. There were 4 dignitaries to judge the student-teachers. Students from 12 colleges participated in this event. The hosts conducted the competition in two tiers. The first level was teaching and the second level was ‘Just-a-Minute’. Student exhibited their teaching competency first. Then they were tested with three different activities to be performed within a minute viz. memory game, spot the difference and a speech. After the valedictory function the winners were announced. Eight student-teachers were selected as winners and one among them was awarded the Abdul Kalam award.

### MATHEMATICS GENIA 2.0

On 31/1/2020 Student-teachers from our college participated in Mathematics Genia 2.0, a National level Intercollegiate competition conducted by Thiagaraja College of Preceptors, Madurai. This initiative was to spotlight the innovation of the students in mathematics, to enhance and enrich mathematics skills among the students, to inculcate creative and divergent thinking among students, etc. More than 800 students, from 60 colleges, that included both B.Ed. and Arts and Science colleges, participated in the event.

Our college participated with 25 student-teachers in all the competitions held viz., Turn coat, Mathematics Rangoli, Mathematics Models, Bottle of Brains, Online Quiz, Mathematics Poster Presentation, Memory Wizard, Dumb Charades, Best out of Waste, As you like it. Towards the end RJ Guru from Radio Mirchi gave a speech on cleanliness of the city of Madurai and invited all the participants to take part in a 2-day programme. At last prizes and certificates were distributed by the dignitaries. It was a beautiful and knowledge-gaining experience for us.

## DISTRICT LEVEL CULTURAL AND SPORTS MEET

On 10/2/2020 the student-teachers of St. Charles College of Education took part in the district-level cultural and sports meet conducted at Justin College of Education by the TNTEU. The programme was organised for two days. The first day started with the inauguration of the cultural meet. The events of the day included competitions like singing, essay writing and speech. The chief guest gave a valuable speech on the need for a cultural fest. Students from numerous colleges participated in the events and displayed their talent seamlessly. Student-teachers, L. Our faculty members are recognized as resource persons and examiners of other educational institutions.

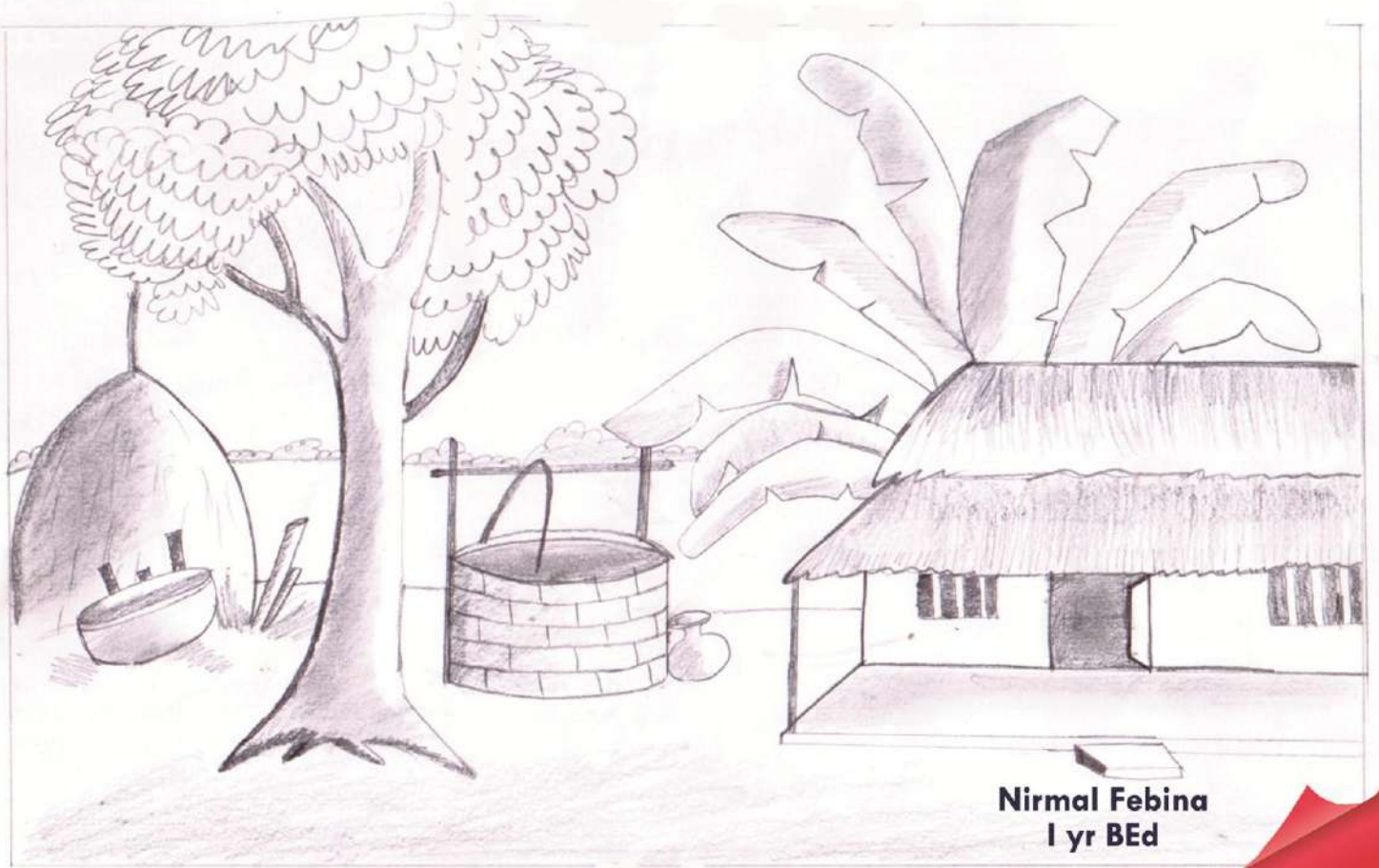

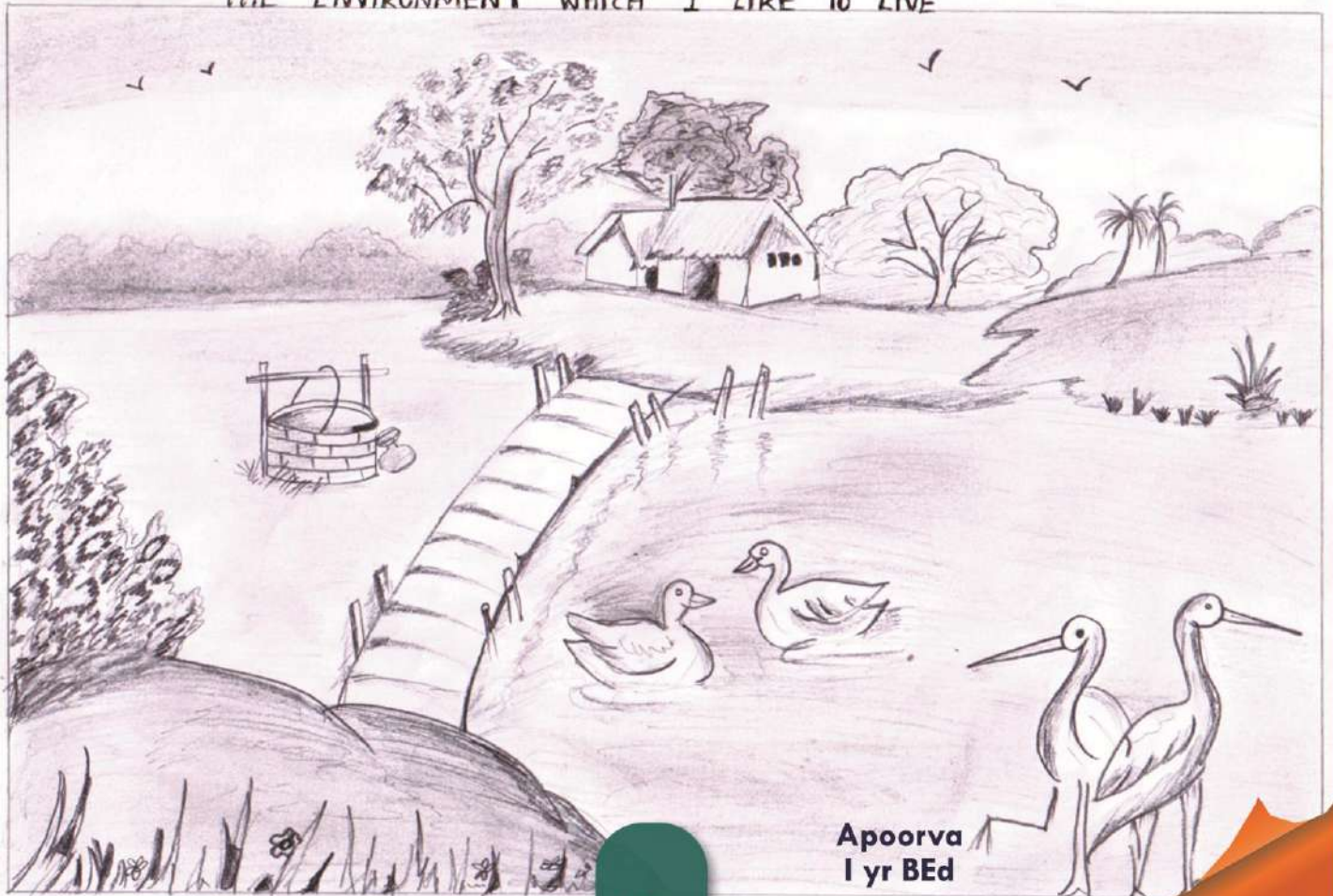
### **Paper Presentation:**

The management encourages its staff members to be industrious in updating and empowering themselves through participation and attending the seminar and workshop organized by other colleges and universities.

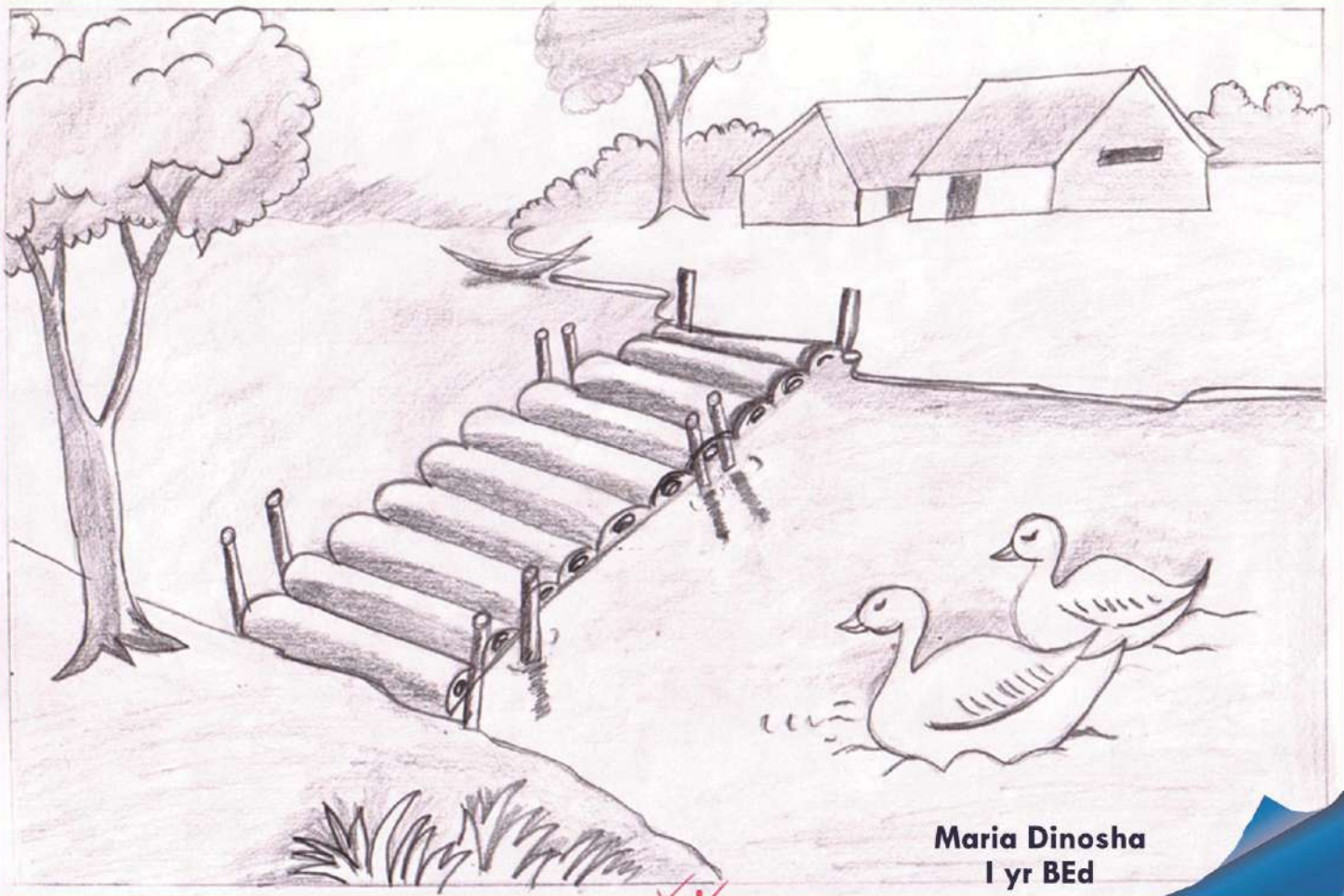
